This edition of the Epiphany Times is dedicated to the school principal, Miriam Havey (Merri) who has selflessly dedicated herself to EOL for the last 19 years. As Ms. Havey begins her 20th year at the helm, our key reporter, Thomas Harrity, was on hand to ask her some questions:

How has the school changed in 20 Years?

Technology has grown by leaps and bounds. However, kindness, respect, perseverance and growing in love of God have not changed.

What is your favorite memory over the last 20 Years?

I have many favorite memories but I have to say that I am most proud that every single senior from EOL at La Salle is a member of the National Honor Society. I also remember with sadness how much everyone loved Mrs. Cromie and couldn't wait to build the playground in her honor.

Has the curriculum changed very much?
